HOLIDAY DECORATIONS AND NFPA

Holiday Decoration and NFPA:

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and the U.S. Fire Administration (USFA), estimate 240 home fires involving Christmas trees and another 150 home fires involving holiday lights and other decorative lighting occur each year. Some decorations commonly displayed during the holiday season may not be suitable for use in a Licensed Care Facility per NFPA life safety code. Decorations and Finishes - NFPA 101, Life Safety Code, Section 19.7.5.4 "Combustible decorations shall be prohibited in any health care occupancy unless they are flame retardant."



Prohibited decorations include: NFPA 101 Section 19.7.5.4.

- Natural cut Christmas trees. International Fire Code (IFC) 806.1.1.
- Fresh cut evergreens for decoration.
- Paper tree ornaments.
- Trees, plants, displays, hangings, and other decorations must not block exits, visibility of exits, or fire protection appliances. NFPA 101 Section 7.1.10.2, IFC 806.3.
- Burning candles. NFPA 101 Section 13.7.2, IFC 308.1.5.
- Never hang decorations from fire sprinkler heads or pipes. NFPA 25, 2-2.2 (1998 Edition). Decorations that are allowed include:
- Artificial Christmas trees that comply with the International Fire Code. IFC 806.2.
- Decorations that are non-combustible or flame retardant. IFC 807.1: IFC 807.2.
- Decorations, such as bows and paper cut-outs that are flame resistant. IFC 807.2.
- Decorative lighting that is approved by a testing laboratory such as UL, used only in supervised areas and turned off when not in use. IFC 806.5.

Other fire prevention measures:

Resident Rooms

- Rooms should be neat and orderly.
- All items must be 36" from heaters. Watch for blankets and other cloth material too close to heaters. IFC 305.1; IFC 603.5.1.
- Do not accumulate combustible materials, i.e. newspapers, laundry or clothing. IFC 304.1; IFC 304.2.
- Extension cords are prohibited, except when used on a portable appliance, such as a vacuum cleaner. NFPA 70 400.8; IFC 605.4.
- In nursing homes, portable heaters are prohibited. NFPA 101 Section 19.7.8, IFC 605.10. Outside:

Electrical decorations and lighting shall be UL approved.
